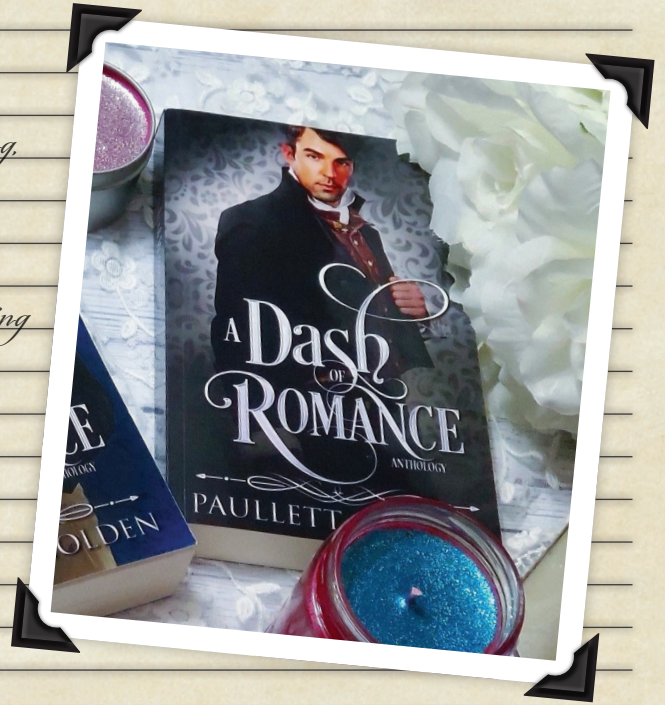
A Dash of Romance

Reader Note

The romance remains sweet but the emotional and physical attraction between the couple is strongly emphasized, and the few kisses shared are described in detail.

Chapter by Chapter

Chapter 1	Abigail privately fantasizes about her fictional knightly hero, including references to "kissable lips," romantic longing, and dreamy emotional attraction. Very light but romantically suggestive	🔥
Chapter 3	Percy's failed courtship and references to his former mistress Clarice are discussed openly. Includes mention of visiting a mistress, implied past intimacy, seductive behavior, and rakish reputation, though nothing explicit is shown on-page. Sensitive readers may especially wish to note this chapter	🔥🔥

Chapter 10	<i>First major kiss in the churchyard after mounting romantic tension: hero cups heroine's face, delivers a slow, sensual kiss with nibbling, suckling, and tongue teasing the seam of her lips; she responds passionately before pulling back in confusion.
